


THANK YOU!

A huge thank you to everyone across Bromborough, Port Sunlight and New Ferry who voted Green on May 5th. Greens came a strong second with 726 votes. This was a massive increase of 128% on last year. This means the Green Party is easily the main challenger to Labour here.

The local elections were a massive success for the Green Party. Across Wirral, almost one in five people voted Green and new Green councillors were elected in Bebington, Birkenhead & Tranmere and Prenton. This means there are nine Green councillors in total. Greens have now easily overtaken the Lib Dems as the third largest party in Wirral.

The way councillors are elected in Wirral will change dramatically next year. Rather than annual elections Wirral is moving to elections once every fours years. This means that all of your three ward councillors for Bromborough, Port Sunlight and New Ferry will be elected in one go next May.

Local campaigner Ruth Molyneux says, "Next year's elections will be the most important ever for our area. We will be working hard all year round to show what a difference Green councillors can make and how important it is to have a strong voice for the local community as we face the challenges ahead together."

GOOD NEWS FOR NEW FERRY REGENERATION SITE

Regenda scheme will see more genuinely affordable homes

Cllr Jo Bird is working with Council officers, Regenda Housing and other local organisations on the step-by-step regeneration of New Ferry district centre. Jo attends monthly briefings with key officers of the council who are working daily on the regeneration programme.

Jo says, "It's a relief that the last unrepairable buildings have been demolished. This comes over five years since the devastating explosion. I'm really pleased that **most of the new houses being built by Regenda next year will be genuinely affordable** and take local families off the housing waiting list. There will also be opportunities for local contractors and apprenticeships – as well as school visits."

Only Green councillors recently voted to save Bromborough library and other community hubs across the Wirral. WOMEN HEROES RECOGNISED AT DELL SCHOOL SITE THANKS TO JO

61 affordable homes are currently under construction on the site of the former Dell Primary School. The site includes three new roads. Cllr Jo Bird successfully proposed these be named after ground breaking local women:

- Mary Mercer Drive is named in honour of the first woman mayor on the Wirral
- Maude Royden Way is named after the suffragist and campaigner for the ordination of women
 - May Sinclair Close in honour of another
 prominent suffragist

Jo says, "I'm really pleased that these three amazing women who achieved so much will be permanently recognised on the new estate."
